Heater, Coal Stoker Stove

These instructions are to be used as a guide to help you maintain your home or office in a safe and efficient manner. They do not replace the requirements of the manufacturer. You should ALWAYS review your owner's manual for additional preventive maintenance requirements.

These inspections are designed to increase the safety and efficiency of your stoker system. Always refer to your owner's manual for detailed instructions on your specific stove.

1. Clean elbows and pipe often. After every two (2) ton of coal is recommended.
2. Clean under feeder shovel two (2) times each season.
3. Clean screens on fans.
4. Clean glass daily (for glass front stoves).
5. Burn oiled coal if possible to reduce dust.
6. Oil the fan motors per manufacturer's instructions.
7. ALWAYS UNPLUG FAN then clean fan blades. After cleaning, plug the fan back in.

Note: Many manufactures recommend end of season maintenance to help preserve the stove from rusting when not in use. Below are some end of season suggested maintenance actions.

After the end of the heating season, stoves should be disconnected from the smoke pipe throughout the non-burning months. This will prevent excess moisture from building up inside the stove body which may cause rusting of the stove body. All fly ash should be removed from the inside of the walls with a vacuum. Use a dry paint brush to lightly remove the dust from the walls and floor. Sponge wipe the inside of the stove with a solution of water and baking soda. Do not get this solution on the paint.

Remove the coal from the hopper. If your stove is kept in a very damp environment during non-burning months, a 40 watt light bulb burning in the stove will help prevent moisture build up. Always remove the ash pan from the stove during the non burning months.
